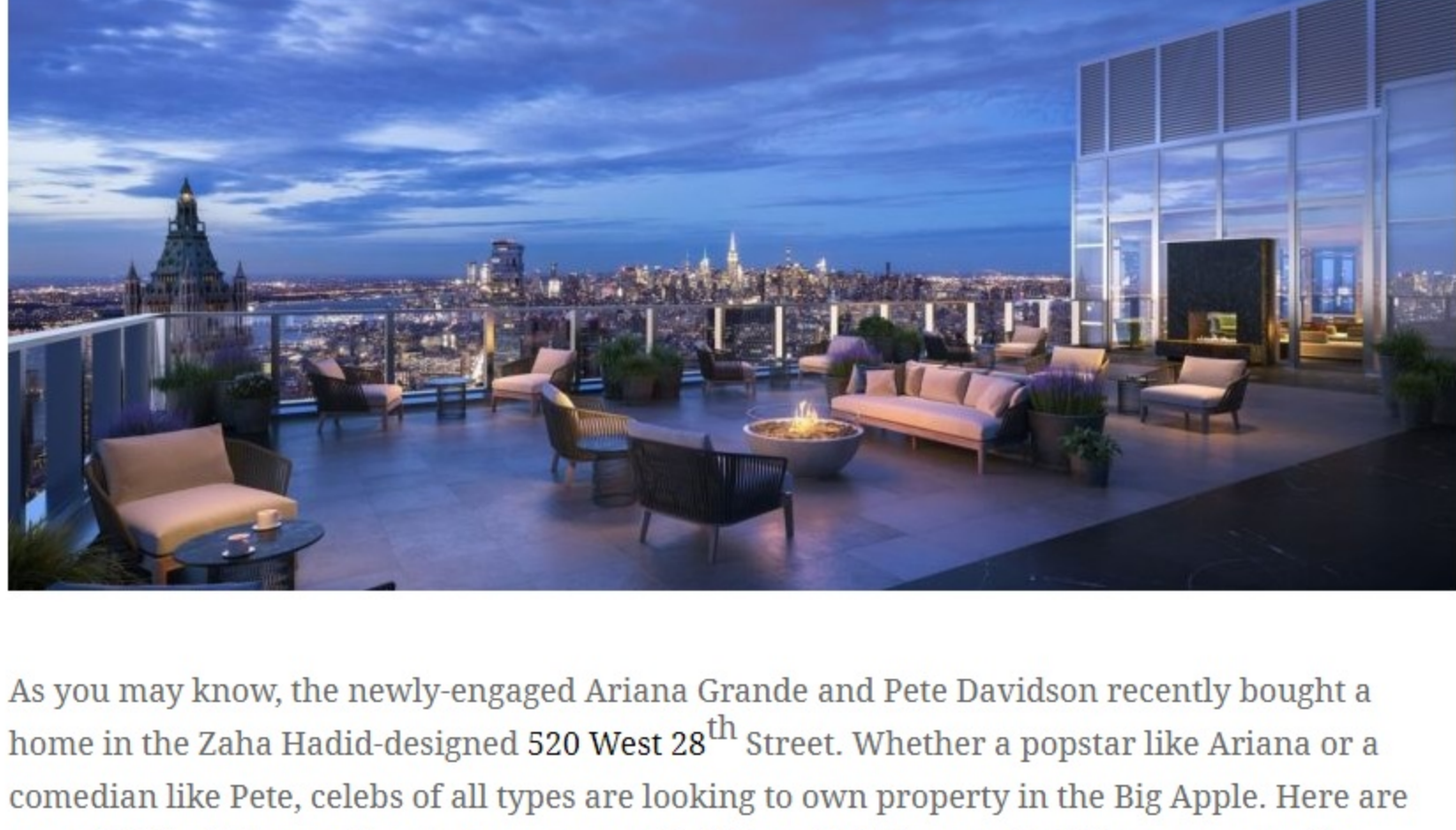


NYC Buildings perfect for any type of Celebrity

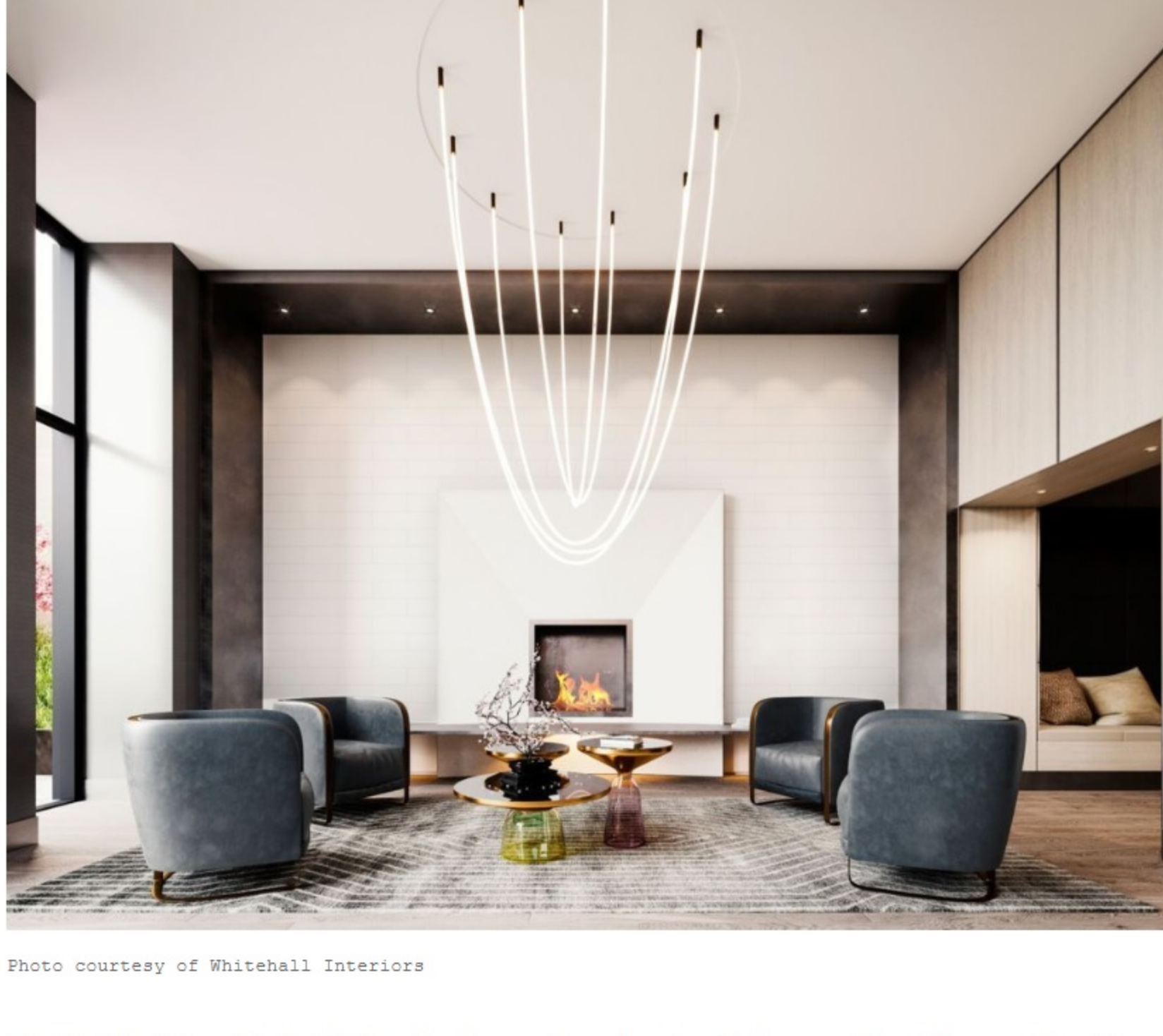

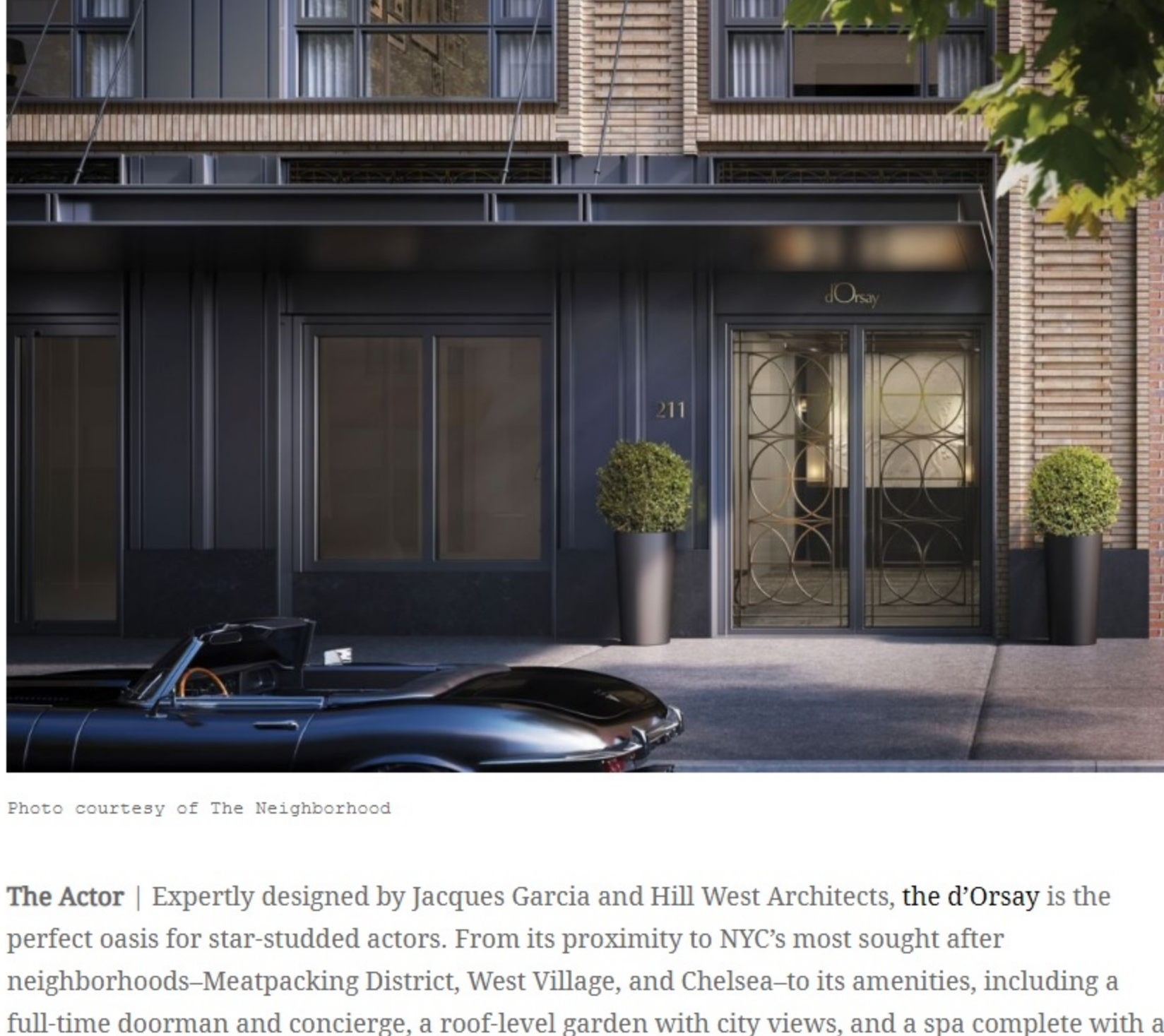

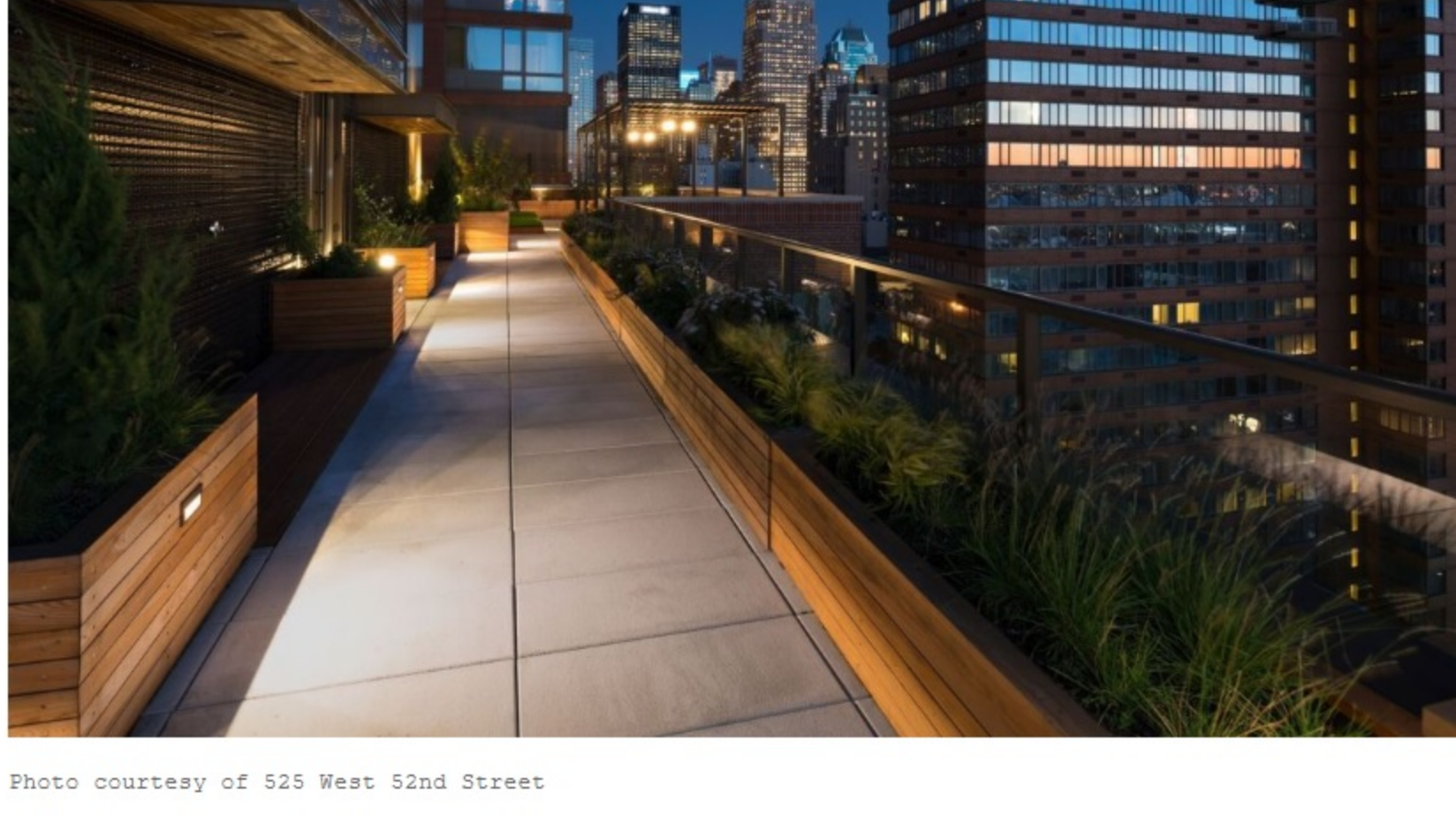
